## 2011 Educational Farm Field Trip Programs

### The Farm Field Trip Where Learning is Fun

Dear Head Teacher/School Expeditions Organizer:

I am writing to invite you to bring your class to the “Wild West” Corn Maze at Scarecrow Hollow this fall for an educational and entertaining field trip. The day will combine the natural beauty of the countryside with a challenging program of problem-solving events and activities. Our programs are designed to increase children’s awareness of the natural world through observation and hands-on activities. We will be welcoming school parties Monday to Friday September 26 through October 28, 2011. No school tours on Holiday Mondays. We limit the number of school parties at any one time, so please book early to avoid disappointment.

#### Fall Harvest Time

Preschool through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will learn about the farm’s role in food production during the fall pumpkin season. A field trip to the Pumpkin Patch is packed with fun and learning. Activities include:

- . Hayride to the pumpkin patch where each child picks a pumpkin to take home. Teachers also pick a pumpkin for their classroom.
- . Students receive one pumpkin, one gourd, a Pumpkin Patch Certificate, and a coloring book.
- . Small hay bale maze and other mazes in the courtyard.

#### Maize Maze Adventure

3<sup>rd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will encounter various learning experiences while working together in small groups to solve Scarecrow Hollow’s world class maze. Activities include:

- . Orientation to the maze with emphasis on teamwork and facts about corn plants, including how it grows and uses in our diet.
- . Solving the maize maze. Allow at least 1.5 hours to solve the maze. This year’s “Wild West” theme has more clues than ever to assist solving the maze.

- . Courtyard activities as time allows.
- . Students receive one pumpkin and one gourd to take home.

### **2010 Fees**

\$7.00 per student. Our policy is one chaperone free per 5 students. Extra chaperones and siblings will be charged \$7.00 each (nonparticipating infants under 2 admitted free). \$50.00 minimum fee per group. A single payment for the entire group greatly speeds up the check-in process.

### **Concessions**

Concessions are available weekdays for lunch. Snacks, beverages and hotdogs are available to individuals. If your group would like a lunch quote, please call us as we need a few days advance notice to prepare for group lunch orders.

We have plenty of bus parking spaces and picnic lunch areas for the students. We are in the countryside but within an easy bus ride of most schools. We can provide printed maps upon request.

When our Constitution was signed, 90% of the U.S. population lived on the farm. Today it is only 2%. After a visit to Scarecrow Hollow, your students will be better able to make the connection between the land and food production by experiencing a real working farm. Plan a visit with your class and make learning about the plant world and farming exciting for your students.
